

This increasingly engaged digital community gives The Policy Circle a unique platform to share solutions rooted in entrepreneurial values, personal responsibility, and local agency.

This expanded reach has also led to high demand for our proprietary Civic Leadership Engagement Roadmap (CLER). Our three-month flexible, affordable, and targeted leadership program has already led to women winning elections and securing influential state-level appointments. Thanks to a multiyear grant from the Bowe Stewart Foundation, CLER will attract and equip even more diverse cohorts with a strategic focus, in 2023, on women veterans and military spouses.

You will also learn more about the high-impact events and programs that The Policy Circle hosted around the country. From regional collaborations focused on civic engagement and philanthropy to our national Leadership Summit with experts sharing how to build thriving communities, The Policy Circle events sparked game-changing conversations and built authentic connections amongst our members, sponsors, and partners.








We are passionate about The Policy Circle mission.


We take **ownership**.

The Policy Circle is a nonpartisan, 501(c)(3) organization that provides three interconnected pathways to achieve our mission. We inform a diverse and significant national audience who is hungry for fact-based resources. We equip women through our proprietary Civic Leadership Engagement Roadmap to serve in elected and appointed roles. Importantly, we connect in-person through round table conversations in 45 states and a world-class national Leadership Summit. Our community stays focused on solutions rooted in entrepreneurial values, personal responsibility, and local agency.



Inform

There is a civic literacy crisis in America. Less than 47% of Americans can even name all three branches of government. People need a civics refresh and The Policy Circle provides both foundational knowledge and timely data on pressing issues with our **Policy Briefs**. These robust resources highlight the power of entrepreneurial solutions, personal responsibility, and local agency. Each Brief is designed to spark constructive conversations and local action.

Our Policy Team curates resources from vetted data, reliable media sources, and think-tanks to provide a comprehensive overview of a policy issue. Then, an expert review panel ensures each Brief is accurate and relatable. The Policy Circle's expanding library of 71 multi-media Briefs covers a wide range of issues, from literacy to veterans affairs and housing to foreign policy. These trusted resources spark catalytic and solutions-oriented dialogue, boost civic literacy, and encourage civil discourse.

The Policy Circle further informs with interactive and on-demand programming. The Policy Circle's Move the Needle virtual events provide timely, on-demand opportunities for our members to interact with policymakers, subject matter experts, relevant industry leaders, CEOs, authors, and other leaders to unpack complex issues. These virtual programs drive conversation, unpack challenging policy issues, and provide actionable steps for our viewers to take in their communities across the country.

Equip

The Policy Circle equips women with the tools to drive impactful, local change through the Civic Leadership Engagement Roadmap (CLER) program. CLER is a three-month, experiential leadership development program that launches civic leaders who value freedom and personal responsibility. The innovative and action-oriented curriculum in CLER is designed to equip the next generation of community leaders with the information, skills, connections, and confidence they need to step up to the challenges facing their local communities.

The CLER program provides a refresh on the foundational elements of the U.S. Constitution and civic principles, drives understanding of the opportunities for civic engagement, and creates a roadmap on how to impact local change and expand personal influence.

Following the successful launch in 2021, the CLER program continued to grow throughout 2022, with women around the country participating in its flexible framework. The CLER program is already delivering impressive results with women successfully running for local leadership positions and securing high-level appointments to task forces and commissions.

This upcoming year, CLER will be expanding with the support of The Bowe Stewart Foundation. Their three-year investment in women's leadership will allow The Policy Circle to target engagement in CLER from distinct groups, beginning with the military and veterans community in 2023.

Connect

The Policy Circle believes in the power of bringing people together and serving as a connector for women across the country. The Policy Circle's members convene in their local circles, at our virtual and in-person events, and at our annual Leadership Summit to create meaningful dialogue, learn from one another's diverse backgrounds, and make connections with other civically-minded women. The Policy Circle's proven roundtable model provides an opportunity to convene, connect, and catalyze action in local communities. With 11,000 members, we are building a national movement of women looking to connect with mentors, supporters, and other like-minded women to make waves of change in their communities.

Our thriving community is made up of women who understand the profound impact of local efforts and who are eager to transform their ideas into action. Whether they are calling their elected official to voice an opinion, running for a political office, or starting up dialogue amongst their peers, women of The Policy Circle are active leaders in their communities. Our mission is to be the catalyst that propels actionoriented women to get more civically involved and use their unique talents to find solutions to complex issues.




